garbage man in 1957 Pittsburgh. Excluded as a black man from the major leagues during his prime, Troy's bitterness takes its toll on his relationships with his wife and his son, who now wants his own chance to play ball. The play won the 1987 Pulitzer Prize for Drama and the 1987 Tony for Best Play. Starring Denzel Washington, the 2010 revival was nominated for ten Tony Awards, winning three for Best Revival of a Play, Best Actorin a Play (Denzel Washington), and Best Actress in a Play (Viola Davis).


